Art of Brilliance Programme

This year, as part of our focus on pupils' health and well-being, Paddy from Art of Brilliance will be working with our Y5-7 pupils. Paddy will introduce a wellbeing curriculum on Thursday 3rd October and then the project will be handed over to the pupils to design and deliver their own programme, stimulating pupils' voice in shaping school improvement. The aim is to leave a sustainable, long-term wellbeing ethos, driven by the children themselves, that they cascade throughout the school and the local community.

The programme will run over four days:

Day 1 - Paddy will explore the key principles of positivity, happiness, resilience, goal-setting, personal responsibility, impact, kindness and aspiration.

Day 2 - Paddy will work with the children to begin to identify the actions needed to move our school to new heights of positive excellence. The children formulate a school plan based around '10 things we will do to make this school the best in the county'.

Day 3 - The children will be busy working on their 'brilliant' school plan and Paddy will visit to monitor progress.

Day 4 - The BIG moment, Art Of Brilliance happiness inspector visits the school to judge progress on Thursday 28th November. The children will be expected to present and provide evidence against their '10-point plan'. The inspector will make a judgement and the school will be awarded either an "Awesome" or "Well Impressed" outcome.

We hope that the whole school community will benefit from this fun programme, creating a ripple of positivity that goes way beyond the school gates!
